



PASTEURIZED MILK IS SAFE FROM BIRD FLU (H5N1)

Bird flu does not spread through properly pasteurized milk. There's no live virus in pasteurized milk, infant formula, or other products made from pasteurized milk.

FOOD SAFETY IS OUR HIGHEST PRIORITY

Dairy cows can get sick with bird flu. This type of flu virus can be found in raw milk from sick cows. Pasteurization kills the flu virus (and other germs too).

Both the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) report our milk is safe from bird flu.



MAKE SURE THAT THE MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS YOU SERVE YOUR FAMILY ARE PASTEURIZED

The cartons or packages will say either “pasteurized” or “ultra-pasteurized.”
